After 2 psychiatric wards, 15 months of unknowns, and the start of movement and speech disorders which would continue for 6 years, it was finally determined that Curtis had suffered a brain injury caused by never-treated Lyme Disease.

While progressing from wheelchair, to walker, to cane, to back to her feet, and moving forward with many new interactive concepts, Curtis's movement and speech deficits have greatly improved since learning how to play the ukulele---this hour-a-day activity now an important part of maintaining her life/art practices. 
